COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Knockahollet Primary School and St. Anne's Primary School.

St. Anne's are coming to the end of Year 3 in our Shared Education Signature Project with Knockahollet Primary School, building on previous collaboration and relationships through CRED and PIEE programmes. We have just received confirmation of our participation in Year 4.

The programme both schools have jointly put in place focusses on the key objectives of school, parental and community relationships and collaboration. Staff have consolidated and developed previous work in WAU, Art, Physical Education, PDMU, sport, music and dance. New areas of collaboration took place this year in Art and Design, Literacy and Play Based Learning. The children have had many opportunities to work and socialise together through shared lessons in both schools, a shared topics and projects and a Shared three-day Residential to Carlingford Outdoor Adventure Centre. Parent and Community relationships are being developed through the 'Shared Cultural Night with All-Set. Further opportunities to develop these relationships are being considered for next year.

The Action Plan for Year 4 has been drafted to include more opportunities for school, parental and community involvement. The challenge going forward is to extend the relationships into the local community. There is a focus in Year 4 on developing Music through the Peace Proms event and consolidation of previous work. There will be also be a significant focus on teachers Continuing Professional Development from September 2018 to June 2020 through involvement in a Shared Education Learning Cluster with five other local schools.

LITURGICAL LINKS

First Confession, Confirmation and First Holy Communion were once again very successful. The benefit of extra practice for the joint school choir was evident as many commented on how the beautiful singing added to enrich the ceremony. Parents were very helpful this year providing lifts to the chapel and classroom assistants in helping with the tea after Confirmation.

The joint P7 retreat was a meaningful and excellent preparation vehicle before Confirmation. Father Butler was present and supportive of all the above events.

The "Inside Out" RSE program for Primary 7 pupils was excellent. There is an ongoing need to inform new parents of P7 pupils about the Relationships and Sexual Education program and the benefits for their child.

SCHOOL SECURITY AND BUILDINGS

There were no incidents of vandalism or damage to school property outside school hours. One incidence of young adults being able to scale the security fencing was reported by a parent. Action has been taken to make access at the identified point of entry more difficult.

The Community Hall is being used regularly; usually two to three out of five week nights from September to Easter.

A handball wall has been installed in the Community Hall, kindly sponsored by Loughguile Credit Union, which gives children access to a skilful, non-contact game. It is hoped to offer this for community use in the coming year.

ENROLMENT and TRANSITION

CATHOLIC ETHOS

The Parish Retreat was very successful and is a good opportunity to meet P7 pupils from the other Parish school.

Catholic Schools week was a great success with even more Grandparents attending than last year. Father Butler blessed St Brigid's crosses and as always was very attentive to the children during preparation for the sacraments.

The school carried out a number of charity fundraising activities over the year including World Book Day activities, lenten fundraising, Bun Sales, A 'Red' Day and individual donations from parents. Altogether £643.90 was raised. Donations were made of £600 each to Sr. Patricia in Peru and Trocaire, which included monies raised for charity in previous years.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

The school provides in-class and withdrawal learning support for children who need help to overcome their barriers to learning. This support is provided by LTSS support teachers and through extra support for targeted children in class. Teacher withdrawal of targeted children was possible during the 2017-18 year through use of one half day of principal's release time. Plans are being drawn up for targeted withdrawal support for the 2018-19 academic year.

St Anne's Board of Governors had expressed a wish to develop more opportunities for after school activities. It was hoped these activities would be self-financing, but would be supported by surplus from last year and St Anne's Support Group if necessary.
