- Reminder of school start and finish times:
- P1 and P2 enter the school grounds at 9.00am, through the main pedestrian gate.
- P3 and P4 enter the school grounds at 9.00am, through the lower pedestrian gate (P1-P2 playground).
- P5 and P6 enter the school grounds at 9.00am, through the lower pedestrian gate (P1-P2 playground).
- P7 enter the school grounds at 9.00am, through the main pedestrian gate
- P1 children will go home at 12.00pm from Friday 28th August until Friday 18th September. Children will be escorted to the main pedestrian gate for collection by parents by a member of staff.

- P2 children will finish at 2.00 pm and exit through the main pedestrian gate.
- P3 and P4 children will finish at 2.40pm and exit through the lower pedestrian gate (P1-P2 playground).
- P5 and P6 will finish at 2.50pm and exit through the lower pedestrian gate (P1-P2 playground).
- P7 children will finish at 2.50pm and exit through the main pedestrian gate.

- School records are now being updated. Please fill in the Information Forms sent home at the beginning of term and return to school as soon as possible. As this is the only way we have of keeping up to date contact numbers it is important that these forms are returned as soon as possible.
- School absences must be reported in writing to your child's teacher as soon as possible, usually on your child's return to school. This ensures the correct absence code can be entered to the official attendance register. A pro-forma is available to print from the school website. Please ensure all details are included in any absence notes.

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

| 100% Attendance | 0 Days Missed |
|-----------------|--------------------|
| 95% Attendance | 9 Days of Absence |
| 90% Attendance | 19 Days of Absence |
| 85% Attendance | 28 Days of Absence |
| 80% Attendance | 38 Days of Absence |
| 75% Attendance | 46 Days of Absence |

90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year - that's nearly 4 school weeks!

- Brain Gym for P7 pupils will continue every Thursday from 3.00-4.00pm. Parents will have to collect their children from school as there will be no school bus available at this time.
- Transfer Information—The registration closing date for the AQE Transfer Test is Friday 25th September at 4.00pm. The closing date for the PPTC (formerly GL) Transfer Test is Friday 9th October at 2.00pm.
- Free School Meals—If you think that your child/children may be entitled to free school meals, application forms are available from the school office or the Education Authority Website: www.eani.org.uk. These applications have to be renewed annually, therefore we would encourage parents to submit their applications if they have not already done so. Any applications or enquiries are completely confidential. We encourage all who are eligible to apply, even if they do not intend to take a free meal, as our school funding can be supplemented by the Department of Education if we have a significant number of children entitled to free school meals.
- Swimming There will be no swimming lessons until further notice
- Violin Tuition— Further information will follow after consultation with the EA Music Service.
- After School Clubs for this term have been postponed. We hope to have clubs available after the Hallowe'en break and will publish details in due course.
- St Anne's School Closures List for 2020-21 will be published shortly.
- School Milk— will begin on Monday 14th September.
